He takes her hand and says "Secondly, I want you to relax. Let's have a nice cup of tea, and then" he said with a deep sigh.....

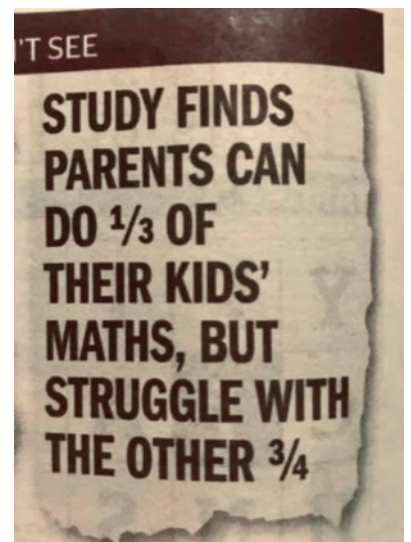
"Let's put all the Corn Flakes back in the box."

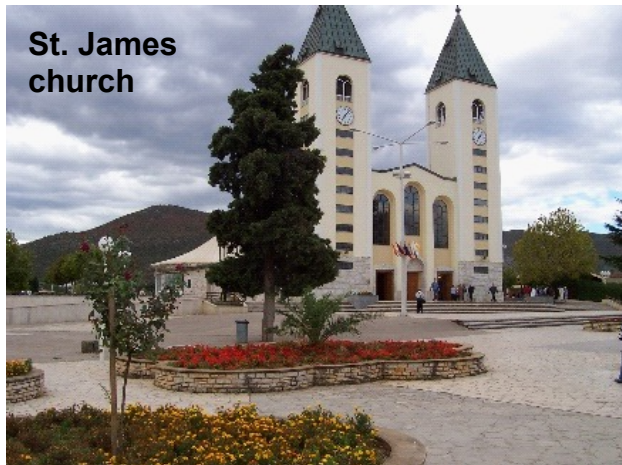

When home schooling is a challenge.....

It is a new year, and I am excited. I am praying that we will be able to go on pilgrimage to Medjugorje this year. I first went with Jan Cavanagh's group in September 2007 and have returned almost every year since. I am "hooked" and want to go back!

Perhaps inevitably, my first visit was the most remarkable. Medjugorje is a truly spiritual place in the Christian part of Bosnia. The overgrown village's centre has an iconic church in the middle of a valley with Apparition Hill on one side (where our Lady first appeared) and Krizevac or Cross Mountain on another which was a local place of pilgrimage since 1933.

As so often happens, it is not only the place, but the people who make pilgrimages special.

When I first went in 2007, it was only 12 years after the "Peace Accord" signed in December 1995 that brought an end to the terrible war in the former Yugoslavia. Medjugorje itself was virtually untouched and avoided bombing, but the villages and towns around it were not so lucky. An orphanage in Medjugorje, Mother's Village, helped children from the conflict. The bus journey from the airport took us past a former military camp and buildings damaged by shelling, bombing and small arms fire.

A pilgrim from another group told us about refugees from the war who had been largely forgotten. They were living in very basic conditions in the next town, Capljina. Some of us visited the camp taking toys for the children and money for their parents. We met Nensi and her family of five who had been living in a tin shed about 12ft by 12 ft for most of the 12 years since the end of the war. They shared a central sanitation block in the camp with broken plumbing and rats. This served about 70 families. Although it was obvious that the homes were freezing in winter, Nensi said that the heat in the summer was far worse.

Most of the families relied on Italian pilgrims bringing food and clothing. The Authorities regularly turned off the electricity. I was shocked that this "forgotten refugee camp" in a town called Capljina was in Europe, less than half an hour's drive from Medjugorje.

Bosnia Herzegovina is a troubled country. It is politically unstable, with a rotating presidency of Serbs, Muslims and Christians. There is and has been corruption, and when I asked Nensi in 2007 who was to blame for the problems in her camp, she said “they are all as bad as each other”. The EU gives money, but it does not get through to the people who need it.

Today in Bosnia there is another refugee and migrant crisis near the Croatian border. Bosnia has become a bottleneck for thousands of migrants hoping to reach Western Europe. Most of them are stuck in Bosnia’s northwest Krajina region as other areas in the ethnically divided nation have refused to accept them.

There are thousands of refugees and migrants who are stranded without shelter in mid-winter. Hundreds of migrants have been stranded in a squalid, burned-out tent camp in Bihac. The camp in near-by Lipa, “home” to thousands more migrants, is little better.



In late December, the International Organization for Migration’s chief of mission in Bosnia, tweeted. “Snow has fallen, sub-zero temperatures, no heating, nothing. This is not how anyone should live. We need political bravery and action now.”

I am sure that, like many, I have a special place in my heart for Medjugorje but we don’t think about Bosnia. Can I ask everyone to remember Bosnia Herzegovina in their prayers. The country is in a mess. Can we particularly remember the refugees and migrants.

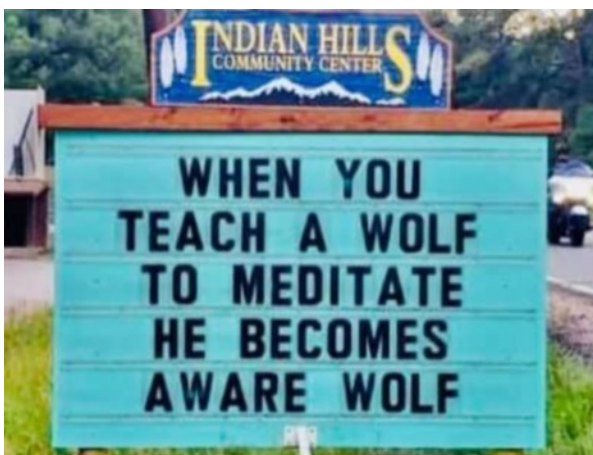
Nensi and her immediate family are now living in Lincolnshire, England, having received help from many people. Her husband Vinko is a construction worker.
