

Saint Felix March 8th

St Felix of Burgundy (and of Dunwich) died on March 8th around the year 647. He was the first bishop of the East Angles and is credited with introducing Christianity to our region and is later praised by the historian Bede for delivering "All the province of East Anglia from longstanding unrighteousness and unhappiness".

The historian Bede, writing in 731, says that The Apostle Felix came from Burgundy as a missionary bishop and was sent by Honorius, Archbishop of Canterbury to assist King Sigeberht in East Anglia. Sigeberht made him bishop of Dommoc (Dunwich or Walton, Felixstowe). A school was established for boys to be taught to read and write in Latin according to the method used in Burgundy.

Sigeberht also granted him a monastery site in an old Roman fort, Cnobheresburg (probably Burgh castle near Yarmouth) where, with the Irish missionary and hermit Fursey, they effected many conversions and established churches in the kingdom.

Felix served for seventeen years until his death in March 647 or 648. There are still a few churches dedicated to St Felix (including in Felixstowe!) and an image of him can be found in Norwich cathedral.

Pilgrimage walk April 9th from St. Mary's Capel to St. Mary Elms, Ipswich



On April 9th we are delighted to be joining with our friends from St. Mary's, Capel Methodist Church and Days Road churches to walk for the first time in 500 years from Capel St. Mary to the Shrine of Our Lady of Grace at St. Mary Elms in Ipswich.

The Shrine was first recorded in 1152 and became more popular than Walsingham as a place of pilgrimage. Among its famous pilgrims were Henry VIII and Catherine of Aragon, Sir Thomas More and Cardinal Thomas Wolsey.

The shrine was suppressed at the Reformation. In 1987 a modern shrine was reestablished by the Guild of Our Lady of Ipswich and an annual Meryemana walk

takes place in September along the Ipswich waterfront to the shrine.

Our pilgrimage will begin from St. Mary's, Capel at 9am and we will walk along pavements and footpaths to St. Mary's Bentley and then to St. Mary's Belstead and onwards to St. Mary's, Stoke. There will be a number of refreshment and comfort breaks along the route. We aim to be at St. Mary Elms mid afternoon. You can join us for one of the sections. Timings are still being worked out. 


Ideas from Pope Francis for Lenten fasts
